Blue Water Audubon Society helps us learn about our Feathered Friends

Last weekend, during a very spring-like Winter Bird Blast, several local birders trained 75 people on tips and techniques for spotting and identifying winter birds. More than 20 species were seen over the two hours of scouting along the St. Clair and Black rivers. Friends of the St. Clair River was pleased and proud to co-host this second annual event.

Did you know that the St. Clair River is designated as an Area of Concern (AOC)? In 1988, the U.S. and Canada identified 43 waterways in the Great Lakes where projects were needed to cleanup legacy pollution problems. It's a long road to recovery with more than 100 years of abuse of our river, but we have made significant progress since the

Dan has been a member of Blue Water Audubon for 40 years and has been an active bird bander for 35 years. One of Dan's favorite birding activities takes him to the heights of the Blue Water Bridge to monitor the local Peregrine Falcon population that nests on a platform built by MDOT. Dan has been actively participating in this monitoring site since it's beginning and has even had a Falcon hatchling named after him. During spring migration Dan spends many hours in a local "secret' spot where he records the hawks flying overhead. Dan and Sara have made many trips both domestically and abroad learning about the birds and studying nature wherever they go.
